Are You ready for..

*Winter*

We're into the heavy coats, boots, ice, snow and COLD season. Maybe we won't have any of that this season ... but if we do be **PREPARED!** If you usually park your car on the street, do you know where you are going to park when the Snow Ordinance goes into effect? If you can, remove vehicles from the street parking areas during a winter storm. The snow plow is much more effective when they can pass through the streets easily and straight along the side of the road.



The snow plow deposits the snow along side of the road. This means that you will have snow placed in the area of your driveway, mailbox and sidewalk. The City may make multiple passes to keep the street area clear. This may require you to clean these areas more than once for each storm. There is no way to avoid this snow placement.

Snowmobiles.....are to be operated on streets that have NOT been plowed, OR on such streets designated as the SNOWMOBILE route OR during an emergency when snow upon the roadway renders travel by conventional motor vehicles impractical. Do not ride over private property. This isn't your property, and you do not have a right to be there. Do not ride over sidewalks. Snowmobile trail maps are available at the Clerk's Office, Calmar Police Department, and Drilling All Season Sports.




Winter is fast approaching and there are many issues to remember concerning snow. Be sure to drive and walk carefully. If you don't have to be out during a storm, please stay in and be safe.



It is the responsibility of the abutting owner to remove snow, ice and accumulations from sidewalks within twenty-four (24) hours accumulation. If the property owner does not remove snow, ice, and accumulation the City may do so at the owners' liability and assess the cost against the property owner. You will be notified and given one warning; either a door posting or a visit /call from the police department. If the accumulation or snow or ice isn't removed after this notification the City will take action to correct the problem at your expense. **Remember when you move snow, blow snow or shovel. It is unlawful for any person to throw or push snow or ice from private property onto any street or alley OR the property of your neighbor.**

## A SNOW EMERGENCY

is when snow fall accumulates to 3" or more. At this time vehicles shall park on the even side of the street until snow is removed, then move vehicles to the odd side of the street. Vehicles are to park in the North lot uptown until the south lot is cleared, then move the vehicles to the south lot. The fine for violations is \$ 25.00. **SNOW REMOVAL** is always a challenge. We strive to remove snow and ice safely and as quickly as possible. **PLEASE HELP BY FOLLOWING THE RULES.**



## Bill Payment Options: Take Your Pick



Paying the bills is a task none of us likes. At the City of Calmar, we try to make paying your utility bill easier. Check out the options below.

### 1) DIRECT PAY...THE EASY WAY!

This payment plan saves you time and money! It is an option that automatically withdraws your water payment from your checking or savings account around the 5th day of each month. You will receive a bill just like you do now but you avoid the hassle of writing checks and mailing bills! No more missed payments, late fees or searching for stamps.

To sign up for DIRECT PAY, stop at the clerk's office or call to have an authorization form mailed or emailed to you.

### 2) PAY at CITY HALL

Payments may also be made at City Hall. Please bring your billing statement along if possible. We accept cash, checks or money orders.

### 3) NIGHT DEPOSIT for Night Owls

Another option is to drop your payment in our drop box located outside City Hall. You can drop payment off anytime day or night.

## Winneshiek Energy District

Green Iowa AmeriCorps is back in action!"

The Winneshiek Energy District in partnership with Green Iowa AmeriCorps are here and ready to help all homeowners and tenants in Winneshiek County improve home comfort and save money by lowering energy use.

"Those who wish to save some money and make their homes more comfortable this holiday season should know that Green Iowa AmeriCorps is back and ready to help," says David Paquette, Energy Conservationist at the Winneshiek Energy District.

Green Iowa AmeriCorps (GIA) members are well trained and prepared to provide many services for Winneshiek County. Ranging from their "Direct Install" program, a residential energy efficiency service, to facilitating energy education programs as well as leading community outreach projects.

"The Direct Install program focuses on the very simple low-cost solutions to reducing home energy consumption and improving home comfort," say Paquette. "It's the low hanging fruit with big returns that we're after."

Hosted by Winneshiek Energy District, our local GIA branch has helped 264 homeowners and tenants throughout Winneshiek County saving an average of \$150 each year -- directly reducing greenhouse gas emissions by 325 metric tons annually.

"We are excited to have a new team to help us make Winneshiek County more energy efficient," says Joel Zook, Energy Conservationist and Home Energy Planner at the Winneshiek Energy District. "This team is well trained to help people make small changes that result in big cost savings and more home comfort."

For those who have missed out on GIA's weatherization services, now is your chance to sign up and participate in the Direct Install program. This program facilitates low-cost energy efficiency upgrades to all Winneshiek County residents, including homeowners and tenants.

The Calmar Fire Department would like to remind you to clear snow away from fire hydrants as you shovel and plow sidewalks and driveways. When recovering from a major snowfall, it's easy to forget emergency responders not only need access to your front door, but to the equipment that will help save your home in the event of an emergency.

## Safety Tips for Heating Your Home

Safety is crucial in a heating emergency. The following is a list of general guidelines related to alternative heating resources.

- Children should not have access to portable heaters, electric or fuel powered
- Do not burn anything larger than candles inside your home without providing good ventilation such as opening windows, doors and fireplace flues
- All heaters that run on fuel (natural gas, kerosene, butane, oil) should be vented. The only exception to this rule is electric heaters.
- Do not use the kitchen oven or stove top to heat your home. This can be a fire hazard as well as a source of toxic fumes
- "Space" heaters need their space. Keep anything combustible at least three feet away.
- If you are using supplemental portable electric heaters, never use an extension cord. Plug them directly into the electrical outlet.

### RECIPE Corner

#### Nutty Egg Nog Cranberry Bread

##### Bread

2 cups baking mix (such as Bisquick)

3/4 cup sugar

1/2 t. nutmeg

3/4 c. eggnog

1/4 cup melted butter, plus extra for pans

1 tsp. vanilla, 1 tsp. rum extract

3 eggs

1 cup walnuts, coarsely broken or chopped or use your favorite nut

1 cup cranberries (fresh or frozen, thawed, halved or coarsely chopped or 1 cup dried cranberries may be substituted.



##### Glaze

1/2 cup powdered sugar and 1 tbsp. eggnog

Preheat oven to 350 degrees and butter 3 miniature loaf pans. Stir baking mix, sugar and nutmeg in bowl, whisk together egg nog, butter, extracts and eggs in bowl. Add to dry ingredients and stir until flour is almost incorporated. Add nuts and cranberries and stir but do not over mix. Spoon into pans and bake 40 minutes or until toothpick comes out clean. Cool completely and remove from pans and drizzle with egg nog

### COLD WEATHER REMINDERS

Replace the batteries in your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors. Test them by pushing the test button. (Temperature extremes can reduce the life and performance of batteries in smoke alarms, causing them to activate when no smoke or fire is present.)

Clean your chimneys and replace your furnace filters.

Now is the time to trim your trees (over the sidewalk and street) while the tree is dormant

Sure, the majority of birds head south for the winter, but that doesn't



mean its time to stop buying birdseed. According to the Audubon Society, more than a hundred bird species supplement their natural diets with food offered at feeders, and in winter, when food is scarce, human assistance is especially important.

## CAR WINTER SURVIVAL KIT

Each year, hundreds of people find themselves stranded on the roadside. Winter weather can kill an unprepared person who is exposed to the elements within minutes. Whether you wind up needing it or not, a winter survival kit for your car is a good idea. It is simple to create and could save your life in the event of a vehicle breakdown or crash during the winter months.

Putting your kit together is easy and here's how! Take an empty container, like a three pound coffee can with a plastic cover, and pack the container with the following items: Candle stubs and matches, small sharp knife, red bandanna or cloth (to hang outside your vehicle as a sign of distress), large plastic garbage bag for insulation, snacks (high energy food like a chocolate bar or energy bar), plastic whistle (to alert people to where you are), plastic flashlight and spare batteries, first aid kit, bottled water.
