### **CITY OF CALMAR SNOW REGULATIONS**

**136.03 REMOVAL OF SNOW, ICE AND ACCUMULATIONS.** It is the responsibility of the abutting property owners to remove snow, ice and accumulations promptly from sidewalks. If a property owner does not remove snow, ice or accumulations within a reasonable time, not to exceed twenty-four (24) hours following the cessation of snow fall or the forming of ice, the City may do so and assess the costs against the property owner for collection in the same manner as a property tax.

**69.11 SNOW EMERGENCY.** Whenever the City experiences a snow fall which accumulates to a depth of three inches or more, a snow emergency shall automatically be in effect and all procedures prescribed by this chapter shall be observed by all persons. The street superintendent shall utilize, at his discretion, all available communications media in the community to give notice to the public that a snow emergency is in effect, but failure of a person to receive such notice shall not constitute a defense to any prosecution for violation of the rules, regulations and procedures prescribed by this chapter where a snow accumulation of three inches or more has occurred.

1. While a snow emergency is in effect, curbside parking of motor vehicles shall be permitted only as follows:

A. All vehicles shall be parked on the side of the street where buildings bear even numbers, until such time as the snow has been removed or plowed from the opposite side of the street where buildings bear odd numbers, until such time as the snow has been removed or plowed from the opposite side of the street.

B. All uptown parking must be in the North lot until the South lot is cleared, then vehicles must be moved to the South lot.

C. Such plan of alternate parking shall supersede all posted parking restriction signs until the completion of snow removal from both sides of any given street within the City limits, after which regularly established parking regulations shall resume and shall be observed by all persons.

2. Removing Violators from the Street. In case any motor vehicle is found parked on any street or alley or parking lot in the City in violation of established or snow emergency restrictions, the Police Department or Street department or anyone under their direction is authorized to move such vehicle and to tow such vehicle to a designated impounding area at the owner's expense. When such vehicle is reclaimed by its owner, there shall be assessed, in addition to any court-imposed fine and costs, a reasonable fee for towing and storage. Neither the City nor its employees or agents designated to move vehicles in accordance with the

provisions of this chapter shall be responsible for any damage to such vehicle occasioned by such moving, towing or storage.

3. Interference with Snow Removal. Any vehicle parked or standing on any street or alley or parking lot in violation of any provision of this chapter so as to interfere with prompt and orderly snow removal is declared to be a nuisance, and in addition to being subject to removal and impounding, may be ticketed for illegal parking, and its owner, upon conviction, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject to a fine of \$25.00.

4. Reclaiming Impounded Vehicles. Any person who removes an impounded vehicle from any police-designated impounding area without first paying all fines, cost, towing and storage charges, is guilty of a misdemeanor.

**NEW POSTINGS OF SPEED LIMITS**

Citizens and people traveling through Calmar will soon see some speed limits and sign posting changes.

Starting in June of 2007 the Iowa Department of Transportation with cooperation from the Calmar Police department started an extensive speed study. The study was conducted over several months with the final plan being accepted in late October.

The Iowa DOT sets regulatory speed limits on state and federal highways based on a thorough engineering and traffic investigation.

- These factors are considered:
- road type and surface (curve, hill, etc.);
  - location and type of access points;
  - existing traffic control devices;
  - crash history;
  - traffic volume;
  - sight distances;
  - results of a field review and speed study

The most important part of the speed investigation is the speed study. When choosing a speed drivers take many roadway environment factors into consideration. Therefore, the speed that the majority of people consider prudent is an important value. Data is collected on the roadway under ideal driving conditions. A technical analysis is done on the results to determine 85<sup>th</sup> percentile. This is the speed value indicating the speed which most (85%) drivers are traveling at or below. Experience has shown that a posted speed limit near this value is the maximum safe and reasonable speed. Studies have shown that traveling much faster or slower than this value can increase your chance of being in a crash.

In Calmar the speed limit changes will be as follows;

- Highway 52 north bound, entering from the East. 55mph, 45mph to 30mph in town
- Highway 150 approaching from the south will remain the same.
- Highway 24 approaching from the west; 45mph will be extended to the west; 30mph in town; with new signs for pedestrian crossings.
- West Main Street; 25mph from Charles Street to Maryville Street.
- Highway 52 south, approaching from the north; 55mph, 45mph to 30mph in town.
- One block from the main intersection, in any direction will be 25mph.

There will be a transition/acquisition period, approximately one month for motorist to become comfortable with the new speed limit postings. During this period, the Police Department will attempt to issue only warnings for minor speed violations. After this period there will be a proactive effort to identify and ticket all violations. Motorists need to be aware that the posted speed limit is the speed limit and the tolerance for violations will be minimal, tickets, not warnings will be issued for speeding.

### **SNOWMOBILE REGULATIONS**

***ATV's and Snowmobiles shall be operated only upon streets which have not been plowed during the snow season and on such other streets designated as the Snowmobile Route (maps are available at the Clerk's office) or during an emergency when snow upon the roadway renders travel by convention motor vehicles impractical.***

## **SIDEWALKS**

***City personnel will be doing another sidewalk inspection shortly. Anyone who received a letter previously but has not completed sidewalk repairs will need to complete them first thing in the spring. (Remember a permit is required, no fee is necessary) The new inspection will include anyone with previous problems and any problems that have developed since or were missed in the last inspection. Letters will be sent to these residents and a deadline set to complete the work. Safe sidewalks protect you from liability.***
