The 2016 Calmar Street/Sidewalk Project

Oh, my, what an improvement!! We realize there was/is some inconvenience involved but in the end all will be fresh and new and will be well worth it.

The project contractors, Wick's Construction, Skyline Construction and Voltmer Electric are pretty much on schedule.

As the project moves along, the property owners that were required to make improvements to their water or sewer services will receive a bill/assessment from the City of Calmar. At the time the bill is issued the property owner can choose to pay the bill within 30 days or have the amount of the bill assessed to their property taxes.

Re-surfacing of the streets and the two uptown parking lots should also begin shortly.

Another improvement (not part of the street/sidewalk project) will be the surfacing of Lewis Street from Hwy 52 to East Street with 5" of asphalt.

FALL REMINDERS!

PLEASE be a considerate neighbor, and a good citizen—do not rake or blow your leaves into the street. They’ll just blow into your neighbor’s yards and/or clog up the storm water drains.

BURNING of yard waste IS allowed

You can burn from September 15th thru November 15th ONLY and between the hours of 8:00 A.M. and 6:00 P.M. No burning on the blacktop or hard surface of any street or alley or in curb & gutters. Before you burn, check the wind speed and direction and be considerate of your neighbors.

A survey has been completed by city council members and we have **MANY** trees overhanging the street that need to be trimmed to a height of no less than 15’ above the surface of the street and 8’ above the surface of the sidewalks. Take a look at the trees in your yard or boulevard and PLEASE take care of getting them trimmed. Low hanging limbs can damage busses or trucks that drive or park on the streets. Affected property owners were sent a letter with compliance required by November 1st.

The yard waste site is available for grass clippings, leaves, tree limbs, walnuts, apples etc. Please note that there are separate places for the tree limbs and the items that can be composted.

Now, there are flowers and there are WEEDS, our ordinance states that weeds or grass in residential areas not to exceed 6” in height. There are many places in town that have noxious weeds on their property that need to be taken care of. Check around your house and yard and please take care of this problem.

RECEIPE CORNER

APPLE CIDER DONUTS

- 2 cups apple cider
- 3 cups all-purpose flour
- 1/2 cup whole wheat flour
- 2/3 cup packed brown sugar
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 3/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/4 teaspoon each ground cardamom, nutmeg, cinnamon and all-spice
- 2 large eggs
- 6 tablespoons butter, melted and cooled
- Oil for deep-fat frying



Directions

1. In a small saucepan, bring cider to a rapid boil; cook over high heat until reduced by half, about 12 minutes. Cool completely.
2. In a large bowl, whisk flours, brown sugar, baking powder, salt, baking soda and spices. In a small bowl, whisk eggs, melted butter and cooled cider; stir into dry ingredients just until moistened (dough will be sticky). Refrigerate, covered, 1 hour or until firm enough to shape.
3. Divide dough in half. On a floured surface, pat each portion to 1/2-in. thickness; cut with a floured 3-in. doughnut cutter.
4. In an electric skillet or deep fryer, heat oil to 365°. Fry doughnuts, a few at a time, 1 minute on each side or until golden brown. Fry doughnut holes, a few at a time, 1 to 1-1/2 minutes on each side or until golden brown and cooked through. Drain on paper towels; cool slightly. If desired, dip tops of doughnuts into glaze of your choice. **Yield:** 1 dozen doughnuts plus doughnut holes.

CALMAR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT NEWS

Over two years ago representatives from the City of Calmar, NICC and Calmar Development began meeting to see how they could identify ways to increase economic development activities within Calmar. Those efforts are beginning to show results.

Two of the most noticeable outcomes of these efforts are the arrival of Dollar General and Subway to the Calmar Community. Construction and expansion of N.E. Iowa Spray Foam Insulation and Albertson Construction is another project from these combine efforts. Other projects that have been announced and in the pipeline include construction of Pivo Brewery and Blepta Studio in the spring of 2017.


