BURNING REGULATIONS

Spring is here and we are again thinking of sprucing up our house and yard. We have a little reminder for you regarding our burning ordinance.

Open Burning is RESTRICTED. Burning of leaves is allowed from April 1st thru May 15th and from September 15th thru November 15th ONLY and then between the hours of 8:00 A.M. and 6:00 P.M.

There is to be no burning on the blacktop or paved surface of any street or alley or in curbs and gutters within the City limits.

I would like to tell you a little about myself and family and give you an insight of where the Police Department is headed and what is in store for the future.

Most of you have read the newspaper articles about the new chief so by now you have a good idea of who I am and where I am from. On the personal side of things my wife Darci of 20 years and 5 year old son Brock are excited to be in Calmar and are getting somewhat settled in to our new house in Calmar. We look forward to becoming an active family in the community and be a part of the many positive changes that are coming to Calmar.

My family and I enjoy many outdoor activities from hiking, bike riding, gardening, sledding and Brock and I will enjoy the pool during the summer. We have been active in the church and look forward in becoming active with a local church. Darci stays busy having debates with and chasing Brock and has recently moved her kids variety store to the area so I hope you stop by and say hello.

Now for some vision of where the Police Department is headed and what direction I have in plan for the Police Department. The total remodel of the Police Department is near completion and is looking great. With the office space and updates it gives us a more professional and efficient place to conduct the day to day business. I have completed an inventory and needs assessment of the Police Department equipment and plan on replacing some much outdated and worn out equipment. By this summer I hope to have the Police Department on a computerized records system which will make investigations and case file records more efficient.
