

This year our downtown area was jazzed up by beautiful hanging flower baskets. This project was accomplished primarily by Sam Sabelka with the help of Junior Boyer and Kyle Meyer. Sam approached the City Council requesting permission to hang some baskets. Sam took this project on, got the baskets and he watered them every day early in the morning. Sam has big dreams for big beautiful flower baskets for next summer. He would like to see 80 flower baskets lining the four main roads into town.

These baskets will be purchased through a gentleman in Minnesota who does this for many towns in Northeast Iowa and Southeast Minnesota. We will receive the baskets in May and in the fall the pots will be returned for replanting the following year.

We will publish a list of sponsors in our Summer 2011 Newsletter. A project like this can only reach its full potential with the help of volunteers. Currently we are also looking for volunteers., young or old, groups or individuals to volunteer to work under Sam's direction to water these baskets next year. They must be watered daily. If you or your group would be willing to donate some time for this project let the city clerk know. Sign up for a day week, month or whatever you feel you can handle. The city has a trailer with a large tank and a watering wand to do the job. This is pulled by a city owned lawn tractor.



LOCAL OPTION SALES TAX, A VALUABLE TOOL

Every time you buy locally (in Winneshiek County), you play a role in funding many important projects through the one percent Local Option Sales Tax (abbreviated as LOST). The voters of Calmar approved LOST several years ago and the funds can be used for any legal purpose of the City. Therefore, it provides a stable and flexible funding stream as times and priorities change.


Calmar typically collects over \$ 90,000 in LOST funds each year. LOST is used in Calmar primarily to support the general fund.

Recipe Corner

GLAZED APPLIE PIE BARS



Pastry:

- 1 egg separated, reserve the egg white
- 1/2 cup milk
- 2 1/2 cups flour
- 1 t. salt
- 1 cup butter, cut into chunks

Filling:

- 1 cup crushed corn flakes
- 8—10 medium tart cooking apples, peeled & sliced (8 cups)
- 1 cup sugar
- 2 t. cinnamon
- 1/2 t nutmeg
- 1 egg white
- 2 T. sugar

Glaze:

- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 1/2 t vanilla
- 1 to 2 T milk

Directions: Heat oven to 350. Beat egg yolk in bowl, add 1/2 cup milk and mix well. Set aside. Combine flour and salt in medium bowl; cut in butter until mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Stir in egg yolk mixture with fork until dough form ball. Divide dough in half. Roll out 1/2 on lightly floured surface into 15X 10 rectangle; place in bottom of ungreased 15X10X1 pan. Sprinkle with corn flakes, top with apples. Combine 1 cup sugar, 1 1/2 t cinnamon and nutmeg in bowl. Sprinkle over apples. Roll remaining dough into rectangle, place over apples. Beat egg white with fork until foamy; brush over crust. Combine remaining cinnamon and 2 T sugar into bowl; sprinkle over crust. Bake for 45 to 60 min or until lightly browned. Drizzle glaze over warm bars.

A FEW FALL REMINDERS



You can burn leaves from **September 15th. thru November 15th. ONLY**, between the hours of 8:00 A.M. and 6:00 P.M. No burning on the blacktop or hard surface of any street or alley or in curb & gutters.

Just a reminder our yard waste site is now located near the sewer plant off S. Jefferson or E. South St. Yard, garden, leaves and tree branches only.

Trees overhanging the street need to be trimmed to a height no less than 15' above the surface of the street and 8' above the sidewalks. The best time to trim is in the fall when trees are dormant. Questions call the clerk's office
